Pre-assessment

For my pre-assessment strategy I have chosen to use a pre-test in writing as well as a short answer survey to see what students know about vocabulary, genre, and literary analysis. These assessments are given during the first week of gifted education to the entire class. In order to determine current student level, need for flexible grouping and remediation or extension.

The writing pre-test comes from the Literary Reflections Language Arts Unit for High Ability Learners from the College of William and Mary (2006). The genre pre-test is based on the materials that will be covered in the unit. Pre-tests are collected by the teachers. The results are then shared with students and become the first entry in the student's portfolio.

Students have continuous checkpoints throughout the year. Four of these are formal and coincide with progress reports that are sent home each quarter. The students are providing with an ongoing dialogue of their progress and what they need to accomplish to improve and/or extend their work.

- 4) What genre is this story?
- 5) Use each the following words in a sentence: fretful, tyrannical, impudent, discomfited.

For questions two to three, read the story with the whole class. Have students share their answers. Students should write with a red pen to add any insights or ideas to their already completed pre-tests. Students should know that these are not graded and will

only serve as a guide to help with progress.

For question four, the story is fiction.

For question five: definition and usage must be correct.
