<b>Email</b> – Yahoo, Hotmail, Google, etc. You can access it from any machine that has internet connection. It is used for communication, to send files, etc.	<b>Email</b> – used to communicate with other students, teachers, families, about a multitude of topics.
<a href="#">Google Calendar</a> post dates to alert the school community, or just yourself of important happenings within the school, classroom, and personal life.	<a href="#">Kerpoof</a> students can create original works of art, animated movies and more.
<a href="#">LearnBoost</a> – a classroom management system to track grades, create lesson plans, and share this information with students and families, and more.	<b>Blogs</b> – students can create blogs to share what they know, review books, post works of art, writing, etc.
